PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



On Thursday morning January 23, 2014 at 7:15AM, I entered Beth El to attend morning minyan to honor my father as it has been nine years since he passed away and this was his yahrtzeit. The service was poignant for me (as I had hoped it would be) and I had the opportunity to share thoughts with those who were there to say kaddish as well as those who regularly attend minyan. As it was a Thursday, Torah was read and there was a scrumptious breakfast after services.

As I was leaving services to go to work, I was struck by how much was going on at Beth El even before I arrived and certainly by the time I was leaving and more broadly about all that goes on during a typical Beth El week.

Our Early Childhood Center opens its doors before 7AM. Teachers, busy parents and adorable pre-schoolers are always moving around early to start the day. Rabbi Krupnick designed the building so the

ECC entrance is right next to the Chapel so the parents and their children can see our morning minyan in action; all can observe and choose to participate in this traditional and religious way to start your day.

The ECC is designed to educate our youngest. However, education continues all day and is available to all. Religious school students fill our building in the afternoons as do Hebrew High students in the evening. Bar and Bat Mitzvah lessons seemingly happen each day. Our Project Lev B'nai Mitzvah program has been expanded to provide education into the teen years and our Soups and Sweets program provides vocational education opportunities for those beyond their high school years. Adults choose to participate in our Adult B'nai Mitzvah program which has a 40 week curriculum that is all mapped out, others choose from a large a la carte menu of courses, while others stop by our library for a book review or to peruse our collection. Rabbi's Pirkei Avot courses are now available on-line in streaming video format and each class is being watched and enjoyed by more and more people. And, every one of our minyan services as well as our Shabbat service affords our Rabbi's and our Hazzan with teaching opportunities which are not missed.

Beth El is a home - it is a Beit Midrash and Beit Tefillah - a home for study and a home for prayer, as well as a Beit Kneset - a home for gathering and for socializing. During this season we have young families planning their annual retreat, our Men's Club and Sisterhood working on Shalach Manot for Purim, our Habonim planning menus and creating meals for our First Fridays, our Hazak group meeting and greeting each other at the library and so much more. We have volunteers who make up our choir, volunteers cooking hundreds of meals for the needy each month, volunteers working on the Midtown Men performance, volunteers on our ECC Board, Hebrew School Board and Hebrew High Board; volunteers helping to maintain our beautiful building, our fund raising, are marketing; volunteers on our Board and so much more. All the while our office staff is working diligently to support this spiritual Goliath - doing so much including making sure our Beth El News is distributed by mail and on-line.

As your president I have been so impressed with all that I have seen. It is a tribute to our wonderful Congregation that we all work on so much to keep our Beth El so relevant and vibrant.

RABBI'S MESSAGE



Rabbi Noah Arnow My Most Memorable Seder

It was very small. And, got smaller. Yet whereas I don't know if I can remember the details of any other particular seder I've been to, I'll never forget that night, that seder.

It was Pesach 2008 and we were in Jerusalem. Finally, after decades of saying "L'shanah Haba-ah Birushalayim - Next Year in Jerusalem" - we were there. My parents, Tammy and me and Caleb, who was less than a year old and celebrating his first Pesach. We were living in Israel for the year while I was studying as part of rabbinical school and my parents came to spend Pesach with us. I was content to catch up with my parents and have (for the first time ever) a small, intimate seder.

We kashered pots in our rented apartment's kitchen, unscrewing plastic handles. Tammy made gefilte fish for the first time ever. (For the record, I've never liked gefilte fish.) We had a couple of random haggadot, as well something very exciting for us: the two volumes of *My People's Passover Haggadah*, which my father had co-edited and written for and worked on for the two previous years. It had finally been published just in time for Pesach and contained a plethora of commentaries, explanations and interpretations of the Haggadah. It's really intended as a reference tool, for scholars and rabbis, as well as for anyone preparing a seder who is looking for some more information to share or discuss about a particular part of the Haggadah.

The table was set, the food was ready. We began the seder. But, if memory serves me correctly, after Kiddush, the baby was ready for bed. And, Tammy was feeling nauseous and sick. And, then there were three. My parents and I continued for a little while, but my mom soon bowed out too, also sick. My dad and I, healthy and crazy, continued the seder. It was a quiet seder. We each had copies of the book and for each section of the Haggadah, we'd select particular comments that were especially interesting to us to share. There was a lot of quiet reading, as well as reading aloud. It was not raucous or disordered, or emotional, or familiar. It was kind of dry, actually and we became a little tired of it, but we pressed on, committed to finishing the experience. And, interpret this however you like, but I can't remember the end of the seder.

But overall, it was my single most memorable seder because it was so different from any seder I'd experienced until then or since. It was a one-of-a-kind, from the location, to the participants, to the Haggadah.

I've had many great seders at my parents' house, at my grandparents' house; at our home here in Cherry Hill. And, I remember moments from individual seders, but I cannot really distinguish in my memory one seder from another.

On the one hand, this saddens me, to have every seder, which we work so hard to craft and organize and prepare for, disappear into the sludge of memory. Yet on the other hand, we

know how it feels to maintain and sustain long-held traditions, to use Grandma's Pesach china for the umpteenth year, to sing the same songs that we learned as children, to relive, if not going out of Egypt, at least our own personal, life-long Pesach experiences.

I want to challenge you though to try to do both - to make at least one of your seders this year radically different from any seder you've ever had. Experiment with the food, or with the setup, or with the way you do the Haggadah, or with the melodies, or with the guest list, or with all of these! If you want suggestions, ask me, or do some Googling for ideas. Make a one-of-a-kind seder this year. You won't forget it and you'll appreciate the familiar that much more.

May our seders this year help us leave the narrow places of our own lives and of our own seders!

Beth El and JFCS join together to create ...

SOUPS AND SWEETS; A food service training program for people with special needs

We are proud that Beth El and the special needs department of JFCS have partnered together to create "Soups and Sweets", a groundbreaking collaboration that benefits people with special needs. Housed in the Beth El kitchen, "Soups and Sweets" is a food service training program designed to provide young adults with special needs an opportunity to gain employable culinary skills. Program participants learn how to work in our commercial kitchen and prepare a variety of soups and dessert, which are sold to members of our community. JFCS chose to partner with Congregation Beth El as we have been a supportive volunteer partner for them in pioneering similar programs for individuals with special needs and their families over the years.

The overall goal of "Soups and Sweets" is to increase employment opportunities for individuals with developmental disabilities. The program, supported with funding from the New Jersey Council on Developmental Disabilities (NJCDD), the Wright Cook Foundation and the New Jersey State Office of Faith Based Initiatives began as a six month pilot program and has grown by leaps and bounds since that time. At the completion of the training program last year, a substantial percentage of our participants received employment in such places as Iron Hill Brewery, Lion's Gate, Kellman Brown Academy and as production staff for the Soups and Sweets program.

Beth El has a long tradition of creating groundbreaking programs for children and young adults with special needs such as the Religious School's "Project Lev" and Teen Lev programs, which provide children with developmental and physical challenges with meaningful ways to celebrate their Judaism and the "Schwartz Yachad Initiative", an inclusion support program for children with special needs. We are grateful to our congregants and the Jewish Federation of Southern New Jersey for providing funding and scholarship support for our special needs programming. The Jewish Community Foundation, the Saltzman Foundation, the Naurice and Ingrid Rosen Memorial Scholarship Fund and the Boory Fund are examples of this support.

In keeping with this long tradition, Beth El once again leads the way in our community through its involvement with JFCS and the creation of "Soups and Sweets". Together we can make a difference!

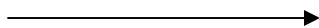

PREPARATION FOR PESACH 5774

Questions and Answers by Rabbi Aaron Krupnick

Q: When is the Fast of the First Born?

A: The *Siyum* of the Fast of the First Born will be held on Monday morning, April 14 at 7:00AM. We will conclude a *seder* (order) of Mishna at the end of services so as to negate the need to fast.

Q: When do we Search for Chametz?

A: Following a thorough cleaning of the house, the search for leaven is held on Sunday, April 13. Breadcrumbs are placed conspicuously in rooms where food is normally eaten. Using a candle, a search is made and the crumbs are whisked with a feather on to a wooden spoon and then in to a paper bag. The prayer said at this time is found in the Haggadah.

Q: What do we do with the crumbs in the bag? Where is Chametz burned?

A: They should be burned on Monday morning, April 14. After morning Minyan (7:00AM), we will have a small bonfire in a steel drum in the parking lot to burn your Chametz. Parents and children can come between 8:15AM and 9:00AM that morning to share in this ritual.

Q: How and why do I Sell my Chametz?

A: On Pesach it is forbidden to possess Chametz.
B: All Chametz that will not be eaten or burned needs to be sold to a non-Jew through a transaction facilitated by the Rabbis of Beth El. (Sale of Chametz form below.) It should be returned or faxed (856) 489-3280 to the Shul no later than Friday, April 11 no later than 5pm.



Foods During Pesach

The following foods are forbidden for use during Pesach: All uncertified products of the 5 specified grains traditionally identified as Chametz: oats, wheat, barley, rye and spelt. This includes such products as bread, cakes, biscuits, crackers and cereal, etc. Ashkenazic custom has us refraining from eating rice, corn, peas and legumes because when ground they can be confused for those grains listed above. However, in a different form, some of the derivative products of these foods are permitted such as peanut oil. With so much *hechshered* food available in our area, it is best just to look for the certification on foods.

Kashering Utensils

Pots and Pans: Silverware and pots must be thoroughly scrubbed, cleaned and then completely immersed in boiling water. Pots should not be used for a period of at least 24 hours between the cleaning and the immersion in boiling water. Metal baking utensils cannot be kashered.

Earthenware: China & pottery etc. may not be kashered.

Ovens & Ranges: Every part that comes in contact with food must be thoroughly scrubbed and cleansed. Oven & range should be on as hot as possible for ½ hour.

Microwaves: After a thorough cleansing, a cup of hot water should be brought to a boil until most of the water disappears.

Dishwasher: The Rabbinical Assembly has ruled that after not using the machine for 24 hours, running a full cycle through empty with detergent will kasher a dishwasher for Pesach.

Tables, Food, Closets & Counters: Should be thoroughly cleaned and covered for Pesach. Then they may be used.

Kitchen Sink: A metal sink can be kashered by thoroughly cleaning and then pouring boiling water over it. A porcelain sink should be cleaned and a sink rack used. If, however, dishes are to be soaked in a porcelain sink, a dish basin must be used.

DELEGATION OF POWER SALE OF CHAMETZ FORM

I hereby authorize Rabbi Aaron Krupnick to be my agent to sell all kinds of Chametz including but not limited to any leavened food, dishes, pots, pans and utensils used with leavened food, which may be in my possession at the address below. Rabbi Krupnick is also empowered to lease all places wherein Chametz owned by me may be found, particularly at the address listed below. Rabbi Krupnick has full right to appoint any agent or substitute in his stead and said substitute shall have full right to sell and to lease as provided herein.

I understand that the sale will be effected at sundown **on Monday, April 14.**

BELL LIBRARY NEWS

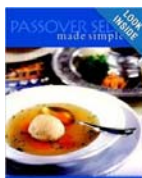

Ah, Spring! The birds sweetly sing, the trees sport new green buds, and the calendar shows that Passover will soon be here. Yes, it's time to start planning. If you're looking to tweak your seder menu, we can help. Here in the Bell Library, we have many new (and classic) cookbooks filled with great Passover recipes.

Leah Schapira's **Passover Made Easy; Favorite Triple-Tested Recipes** features simple recipes for the holiday. Spaghetti Squash Kugel and Eggplant-Wrapped Chicken are among the tempting offerings here. **Passover Seders Made Simple** by Zell Schulman walks you through seder preparation and provides recipes for everything from soup to nuts (literally), featuring both Ashkenazic and Sephardic dishes.

We have cookbooks for special Passover needs including vegetarian and low-fat diets. Of course, we also have books about Passover (not just cookbooks!) to help you get creative with your seders. Start early and take a look – you're sure to find inspiration here.



Voracious readers, take heart! The cartload of new novels described in last month's column has been joined by even more new selections. You won't want to miss such titles as:



Sinners and the Sea by Rebecca Kanner. There are hundreds of children's books retelling the story of the Great Flood, but this debut novel looks at the story of Noah and his unnamed wife from an adult perspective. A modern midrash, **Sinners and the Sea** describes Noah's wife, born with a birthmark on her forehead and therefore shunned as having the mark of a demon. At age 19, she marries 600-year-old Noah, who takes her to Sorum, a town of exiles, where murderers, prostitutes and other sinners run rampant. Noah and his wife have three sons, and when Noah claims that Gd is sending a flood and they must build an ark, he is ridiculed by the community. We know what comes next – Noah and his family are safe in the ark – but what was life in the ark really like? According to this version, there was plenty of sibling rivalry, and Noah's wife proved to be a strong woman. Told from her perspective, **Sinners and the Sea** offers a fresh perspective on a familiar subject.

The Wanting, by Michael Lavigne, begins with a suicide bombing in Israel, witnessed by Russian-born architect Roman Guttman. Though he recovers physically, Guttman has trouble resuming normal life, and also has difficulty controlling his 13-year-old daughter, who is increasingly being influenced by radical Jewish zealots plotting against Palestinians. Guttman's anguish leads him to abandon his work and his daughter, and he sets out to find the family of the suicide bomber. For reasons he cannot explain, Guttman wanders in the desert. Dehydrated, he is found nearly dead by the bomber's father, who takes him in and cares for



him, over the objections of his family and neighbors. The story is told from three viewpoints: Guttman's, his daughter's, and that of the suicide bomber. All three are trying to fill a void in their lives. The morally challenging environments in which these three troubled characters live are skillfully explored, and the author shows sympathy for all of them. There are no easy answers here, just a sensitive portrait of a complex reality. (You may remember the author, whose previous novel was *Not Me*).

Jacob's Oath by Martin Fletcher tells the story of Jacob Klein, a Holocaust survivor. After his liberation from Bergen-Belsen, Jacob joins the other refugees traveling across Europe on foot. He is heading for his hometown, Heidelberg, which is also the hometown of Hans Seeler, a sadistic SS guard who tormented and killed Jacob's younger brother in the camp. Jacob promised his dying brother that he would avenge the death by killing Seeler. Jacob gets to Heidelberg, where he meets Sarah Kaufman,, and the two eventually fall in love. To complete his mission, Jacob will need to separate from Sarah. Which will he choose: Sarah's love, or the promised revenge? Author Martin Fletcher, a noted journalist, also wrote another novel, *The List*, available here in our library.



Many of our books have new bookplates, showing that they were dedicated during this year's Jewish Book Month. Thanks to our generous donors, our annual Jewish Book Month fundraiser was once again a success.
