Curriculum

Hebrew

Fourth graders work on recognition of prayer constructs. They practice word attack skills, recognize key siddur words and their meanings, drill prayer reading to encourage fluency, study more complex prayers and analyze the concepts of commonly recited prayers.

This curriculum focuses on Jewish values, moral development and spirituality with experiential learning. The curriculum seeks to connect children with the textual, ritual and artistic sources of Jewish life, while encouraging their curiosity, imagination and expression. The goal is for children to emerge with a "vocabulary" of Jewish life that goes beyond words, and which informs their sense of what Judaism contributes to their lives, and what they can contribute to the world around them.

Torah From the Prophets and Writings. From the Crossing of the Sea of Reeds to the story of Ezra and Nehemia, Daled students will discuss the challenges, ethical dilemmas, and moral issues that confront the Jewish people and apply it to their own lives.
