Have you ever gotten an ear worm stuck in your head?!!? It can be a catchy tune or an annoying ditty that stays with you. It can penetrate so deeply that it is nearly impossible to focus on anything else!

One of the amazing things about music is that it has the ability to drastically change our mood. It can make us feel happy or move us to tears.

When I want to be inspired, I have been known to listen to Mozart's Requiem, a choral piece which moves me deeply. What makes it so powerful and utterly magnificent for me are the voices. Mozart brilliantly weaves and overlaps those voices in and out of each other. Each successive voice builds upon and responds to the previous one. Sometimes one voice shines above the others and sometimes they come together in 9:00am (or whenever you arrive)! unison or in harmony. The effect is uplifting and spiritual. Each of those voices playing with and against each other, each distinctive, each melodic, and so necessary for those beautiful moments when they all come together.

One of the most moving passages in the Torah is found in Parashat B'shallach. It describes how the Israelites triumphantly sing to G-d after passing through the Sea


of Reeds. They have just escaped from their enemies and crossed the sea in safety. The first thing they did upon reaching the shore was sing!

It is a poignant moment, a high point in our history, a moment we relive each morning when we recite this passage during *Shacharit* (morning services) and which we will chant on Shabbat Shira, Saturday, January 15th. Our shul is filled with wonderful voices. Each voice is distinctive, but can weave in and out of the other

voices. On Shabbat Shira, we will hear voices from our children's choir and our Adult Choir under the direction of Cantor Leon Sher. I hope you will join us for this musical, inspirational service which begins at



My prayer is that we continue to learn to view our community like a beautiful choral fugue with each voice able to contribute the necessary and wonderful sound in order to make a marvelous and integral whole.

HINNENI

Happy New Year! What an incredible four months it has been for all of our Educational Programs here at Beth El. Slowly things are getting back to the "new normal". It is so wonderful to walk into the building every

day and see our youngest learners of the ECC engaging with one another and learning together in their classrooms. After a long year of virtual learning it is also incredible to see our Religious School and Hebrew High School classrooms full of activity as our students are back in the building learning together. It is amazing to see our KaHaL adult education programs back in full swing in person.



One of our weekly traditions that we missed last year in Religious School was our Hinneni Awards. Every Wednesday afternoon during our weekly Tefilot service at the conclusion of the day we acknowledge a student from each grade with a special Hinneni Award. What is a

Hinneni Award you may ask? The word Hinneni means "I am here". In the Torah, Gd asks Moshe "where are you?" Some interpretations suggest that Gd is not asking "where are you physically", rather Gd is asking Moshe where he is in his intentions and actions. Moshe responds with the word, "Hinneni", here I am. We are taught that Moshe's words signify that he was ready to do the work of Gd, to make a difference, and to be a mensch.

This is what we teach here at Congregation Beth El Religious School-the value of fulfilling mitzvot, making a difference, and being a good person (a mensch). To honor our students who fulfill the answer of Hinneni, we acknowledge them with a special award called the "Hinneni Award". Students who receive this award are chosen each week by their teacher based on their actions in class, be it trying their best, helping another student, or performing a mitzvah.

It is our goal to provide each and every one of our students with a Hinneni Award as we hope that each of our students will strive to be the best person that they can be. We work to instill integrity, kindness, compassion, and empathy into the lives of our



students. At Beth El, our aim is to use timeless traditions to teach these values and to help the students live them each and every day. As Rabbi Krupnick said in his welcome message in the Beth El Religious School Handbook, "at Beth El we make mensches and help our kids become the people Gd intended them to be."






