# CLERGY CORNER



#### Rabbi Andy Green

In February, I found myself teaching our Kittah Dalet b'Yachad program through Zoom on my phone. The snowstorm had cut power to the house, but, with my phone battery, I was able to share with our families about mezuzah and the words of the Shema within it. I shared about the deeper meaning of

the Shema: how Gd is deeply invested in each of us personally as 'ours' *(eloheinu)* and committed to all as the 'One' *(echad)* who creates and lifts us all. I shared also about the deeper meaning of mezuzah, that we are reminded of Gd's love for us when we enter our places of home and sanctuary (where Gd is imminent) and as we leave those spaces to engage in the broader world (where Gd is transcendent.) One of my mezuzot at home is made of Jerusalem stone and has the words *'baruch atah bevoecha; baruch atah betzeitecha'* etched upon it, meaning 'Blessed are you in your coming in; Blessed are you in your going out.'

For the past nearly six years, Beth El has been my home and you have blessed me in coming into this community. When I log onto a Zoom call and see your faces, like when I'd look at you in our chapel, our sanctuary, or our Social Hall high holiday set-up, you are a blessing to me. We've grown close through sharing moments of ecstatic joy and deep sorrow, of new Torah insight, and of intimate conversation. I've watched your children grow, mine too. I'm older now. (So are you, but I won't point it out...) Knowing you deeply, because you opened heart to me, is my most treasured gift and greatest privilege. I am awed and grateful. Though I am excited for the next step, leaving this home is bittersweet. As you have blessed me in my coming in, you have blessed me in my going out.

I arrived at Beth El just out of rabbinical school, and you empowered me, you trusted me, and you taught me to be your rabbi. It's different to learn about something than to actually do it, and I'm the rabbi I am today because of you. I've also grown in my rabbinate because of incredible clergy partners in Rabbi Krupnick, Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro, Rabbi Marshall, and Rabbi Furman, of blessed memory.

Rabbi Furman z"I showered me with love, with kindness, with wisdom and good advice, and terrible puns, so terrible that I couldn't help but laugh with him. He was a grandfather figure for me, sitting next to me at minyan each day, telling stories of times past over breakfast at Starbucks or Short Hills or in our social hall, attending my kids' birthday parties, holding my hand on his deathbed... I know he meant so much to all of us. His wit and wisdom, his love and kindness -- his memory -- is an enduring blessing.

And our Beth El team is the best there is:

- Rabbi Marshall organizes the most dynamic youth and adult education initiatives. Her wisdom, humor, grace, kindness, humility, drive, and unparalleled skills inspire me and are a blessing to our community.
- Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro harnesses the power of music and voice to lift us. We have each experienced the magic of her song, the sweetness of her humor, the blessing of her guidance, and the special way she makes us all feel included in worship and ritual.
- And Rabbi Krupnick, my mentor. He talks to each of us like we are the only one in the world. Through his words and deed, he models, challenges, guides, and blesses us, in everything we do. Rabbi Krupnick is the model of being a truly great congregational rabbi - gracious, encouraging, brilliant, and wise.

# **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE**

One of my favorite movies is the 1999 classic, Office Space. It's a comedy about corporate culture in the tech industry and the various personalities at play in the heavily cubicled office. I find myself thinking of this movie as I

write this article, because my responsibilities, like many others, have shifted and increased during the pandemic, and one of the more popular quotes from the movie comes to mind; What would you say you do here?

Prior to the start of this pandemic, there were many ways to answer this question. And now that we are a year into this pandemic, there are even more answers. I could sit here and list them all, and I'm sure that would make for a fascinating article. Although I have many responsibilities, my primary role as the Executive Director is to work together with our lay leaders, clergy and staff to connect people with our community and to each other.

Prior to our Covid related closures, it is fair to say that Beth El was alive with the hustle and bustle of our services and programs all taking place on site. If anyone had asked if there was a way to call in or stream, we likely would have said that it wasn't something we were offering. I would dare to say that were not engaging as many people as could have engaged had we embraced this technology sooner. Once we shut down, we went into hyper-technology mode. Our staff went remote, we turned to Zoom, Facebook Live, Google Meet, WhatsApp, and a few other platforms to connect and keep our community together.

Our clergy filmed videos daily, and we had staff editing and uploading those videos, to stay in touch and provide meaningful, spiritual moments. We had staff spending hours and hours using software to plan routes for clergy to walk miles and miles to visit congregants, neighborhood by neighborhood. We had volunteers and staff coordinating support for our congregants in need. We partnered with vendors to produce professional videos in preparation for High Holidays that were like no other. We held services outside, we held services inside, and we did so for people at home and at Beth El. And this was all done with technology that existed before the pandemic and will surely stay a part of our operations after the pandemic.

I think the quote I referenced earlier should be restated as: *What would you say WE do here?* My answer is taken from our mission statement. We create a warm and welcoming community, where people of all generations are enriched by learning and inspired to discover their personal experience of Jewish life. And now we do it even better, because of technology and the need to innovate. The pandemic has indeed changed us forever. And these changes all support our mission of connecting with our community, enriching their Jewish lives and maintaining our vibrant spiritual home.

# **PASSOVER INFORMATION**



QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

#### Q: When is the Fast of the First Born?

A: The *Siyum* of the Fast of the First Born will be held on **Thursday, March 25 at 7:00am**. We will conclude a *seder* (order) of Mishna at the end of services so as to negate the need to fast.

#### Q: When do we search for Chametz?

A: Following a thorough cleaning of the house, the search for leaven is held on Thursday evening, March 25 after night fall. Breadcrumbs are placed conspicuously in rooms where food is normally eaten. Using a candle, a search is made and the crumbs are whisked with a feather onto a wooden spoon and then into a paper bag. The prayer said at this time is found in the Haggadah.

#### Q: What do we do with the crumbs in the bag? Where is Chametz burned?

**A:** Chametz should be burned on **Friday, March 26.** After morning Minyan (7:00am), we will have a small bonfire in a steel drum in the parking lot to burn your Chametz. Parents and children can come from 8:30— 9:00am that morning to share in this ritual.

#### Q: How and why do I sell my Chametz?

- A: On Pesach it is forbidden to possess Chametz.
- B: All Chametz that will not be eaten or burned needs to be sold to a non-Jew through a transaction facilitated by the Rabbis of Beth El. (Sale of Chametz form below or online at bethelsnj.org/passover) It should be mailed or returned online no later than Thursday, March 25 by noon.

#### Foods During Pesach

#### The following foods are forbidden for use during

**Pesach:** All uncertified products of the 5 specified grains traditionally identified as Chametz: oats, wheat, barley, rye and spelt. This includes such products as bread, cakes, biscuits, crackers, cereal, etc. Ashkenazic custom has us refraining from eating rice, corn, peas and legumes because when ground they can be confused for those grains listed above. However, in a different form, some of the derivative products of these foods are permitted such as peanut oil. With so much *hechshered* food available in our area, it is best just to look for the certification on foods.

#### Kashering Utensils

**Pots and Pans:** Silverware and pots must be thoroughly scrubbed, cleaned and then completely immersed in boiling water. Pots should not be used for a period of at least 24 hours between the cleaning and the immersion in boiling water. Metal baking utensils cannot be kashered.

<u>Earthenware:</u> China and pottery etc. may not be kashered.

<u>Ovens & Ranges</u>: Every part that comes in contact with food must be thoroughly scrubbed and cleansed. Oven and range should be on as hot as possible for ½ hour. <u>Microwaves</u>: After a thorough cleansing, a cup of hot water should be brought to a boil until most of the water disappears.

**Dishwasher:** The Rabbinical Assembly has ruled that after not using the machine for 24 hours, running a full cycle through empty with detergent will kasher a dishwasher for Pesach.

Tables, Food, Closets & Counters: Should be thoroughly cleaned and covered for Pesach. Then they may be used.

<u>Kitchen Sink</u>: A metal sink can be kashered by thoroughly cleaning and then pouring boiling water over it. A porcelain sink should be cleaned and a sink rack used. If, however, dishes are to be soaked in a porcelain sink, a dish basin must be used.

# **DELEGATION OF POWER: SALE OF CHAMETZ FORM**

I hereby authorize Rabbi Aaron Krupnick to be my agent to sell all kinds of Chametz including, but not limited to, any leavened food, dishes, pots, pans, and utensils used with leavened food, which may be in my possession at the address below. Rabbi Krupnck is also empowered to lease all places wherein Chametz owned by me may be his stead and said substitute shall have full right to sell and to lease as provided herein.

I understand that the sale will be effective at sundown on Saturday, March 27.

# BETH EL 100 PAST PRESIDENT ROUNDTABLE AND MEMORIES

We asked our past presidents to share some memories with us. In our first Past Presidents Roundtable, we share excerpts from interviews with Eric Clayman (2013-2015), David Gutin (2003-2005), Lynn Goldman Paul (2001-2003) Stuart Wasserlauf (1983-1985), Linda P. Weiss (1st female president 1989-1991), and Steve Wenick (1993-1995):



When/Why did you join Beth El? Eric: After their marriage, my parents, Irv and Natalie, bought a house on Chapel Avenue which was close to the synagogue being constructed, Beth El. My mom has now been a member for over 50 years. I spent one year taking a bus to Camden for

Hebrew School and continued at Beth El through my Bar Mitzvah, Hebrew High, and Confirmation. Lynn: My family joined Beth El in 1955. When we moved here from New York, my parents became closest friends with Mr. and Mrs. Sidney Wenof. Mrs. Wenof's father was Herman Rappaport who was the president of Beth El. It was only natural we follow.

Stuart: My wife, Judy, and I joined Beth El in May of 1969. After belonging to the synagogue in Woodbury for one year, we wanted to be in a synagogue in a more populated Jewish area. A cousin recommended Beth El. We went there and were impressed with what Beth El had to offer, but the crowning moment was not the synagogue itself; it was when we went to a Young Associate BBQ and were greeted with open arms. It felt like we had always belonged there.

David: We joined in 1981 when my oldest child started to attend Kellman Academy at Beth El in Cherry Hill.

Linda: We joined Beth El in 1968 when my oldest son was 7 and ready for Hebrew School.

Steve: During the 1973 Yom Kippur War, Congregation Beth El opened its sanctuary to the entire South Jersey community in a display of solidarity with Israel. My wife, Bobbie, and I had recently moved from Philadelphia to Cherry Hill and were among a thousand people that evening comforted by the inspirational clergy during that extremely stressful time. It was then that we both knew Beth El was going to be our new spiritual home.

#### What do you think makes Beth El so special?

**David:** Our clergy make Beth El the special place that it is and our willingness to change with the times – becoming egalitarian, welcoming families where one spouse is not Jewish, LGBTQ Jews, and Jews of color to our community – all of these things make me especially proud of Beth El. **Stuart:** Beth El is special for it being a community and, for us, a second home. We had an immensely popular lecture series. As Young Associates President, Rabbi Kahn and I picked up Jacob Javits at the train station for his dialogue with the Rabbi. I was privileged to interact with Elie Wiesel when we picked him up at the airport for the first time he was at Beth El. There were many notable people at the



synagogue during those years, including Chaim Potok, pictured to the left. At the end of my presidency, I was honored by Bonds for Israel featuring Ehud Olmert, future Prime Minister of Israel as presenter.



Steve: Its history of perpetuating and fostering our sacred practices and traditions under the revered leadership and guidance of Rabbi Kahn, Rabbi Furman, Cantor Herman, and Dov Gildin, all of blessed memory. Today's klei kodesh Rabbi Krupnick, Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro,

and Rabbi Green have continued to foster those traditions by welcoming those in our community with special needs, such as our daughter Jill and many others, while providing visionary programming for those who seek a meaningful Jewish experience.

Linda: Two weeks into the school term, Rabbi Furman z"l knew every child by name and there were over 400 children in our Hebrew School at that time - I felt that was very special.

#### What are some of your proudest moments of your time as President?

**David:** On my watch, we hired Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro and the architect who designed our synagogue in Voorhees. These were exciting events for our shul. Eric: As far as my proudest moment as Beth El President, it would be nice to take credit for hiring Rabbi Green although credit (lots of credit!) belongs to Rabbi Krupnick who learned about and executed a much more sophisticated hiring campaign than we had previously used. Probably my proudest moments were all of the many moments when I had bima honors and got to meet and speak to the simcha families. I enjoyed every Shabbat I was fortunate to be on the bima.



Linda: After many years of being involved at Beth El on many levels, it was surprising and very complimentary to be asked to be a Vice-President with no thought to being a future President. Beth El was not an egalitarian congregation at that time and I was not hoping for it to become one. I accepted the Linda P. Weiss limitations that were in place. We were about

1400 families and only a few tried to talk me

out of being President. We handled many problems, among them asbestos that had to be removed (we held services in the Jewish Geriatric Home for a whole summer) and, another time, lightning hit the tower of the sanctuary, but we continued on.

**Lynn:** I think my proudest time was standing on the bima being installed as the second female president and remembering my father's installation and knowing we were the first father/daughter presidents of Beth El. I think it was 36 years in between!

**Stuart:** Being President, there were so many supportive people. I was especially grateful to the former Camdenites. One cannot take that kind of position without all of them. With Nikki Feldman at the helm of the Religious School Committee, we tried to give a lot of importance to the children of the synagogue in order to help perpetuate

Judaism and the focus of my Kol Nidre Appeals was directly for that. After my first year as president, our Executive Director left and I was so grateful to Linda Weiss, a future President, for stepping in and taking over. When there was a turnover of the Cantor, we were fortunate to hire the very

Stuart Wasserlauf mature and wonderful Cantor Jeffrey Shapiro. During those years, reflecting on Rabbi Furman z"I's advice, I had a committee start to explore the extension of the synagogue to the East side of Cherry Hill. Of course it did not happen then, but it was a grass roots endeavor. After my presidency, I was involved in the movement to bring women more involved in the service. When Rabbi Kahn accepted women's part in the service, Zalman Agus and I negotiated that the Chapel service would remain traditional. We wanted everyone to have a place at Beth El.

**Steve:** When we became an egalitarian synagogue, decided to relocate our synagogue to Voorhees, and finally, for the first time in Beth El's history, hired an assistant rabbi. Rabbi Krupnick became our Assistant Rabbi after a rather unusual interview. For some since-forgotten reason, I conducted a one-on-one conversation with Rabbi Krupnick while sitting in a kindergarten classroom, furnished with desks and chairs built for six-year-olds

#### What are some of your favorite memories?



Lynn: There was a certain smell [in the Camden Building] ...a very clean smell. I always think of Camden when it appears. Also, having tea and cookies at the Oneg after Friday night services, and Sunday school and Hebrew school, which were memories, but not always the fondest! We

Lynn Goldman Paul lived in Moorestown and it was a SCHLEP

to Camden. The best was seeing my father installed as President of Beth El in 1965. I will never forget how proud I was of my Dad! Witnessing Beth El become egalitarian, having the first Aliyah, and also being allowed to sit on the Rabbi's side of the bima. I think one of the most poignant memories was at my father's funeral held at Beth El. Seeing him leave the shul for the very last time, it was comforting because he loved his Beth El and fitting that he was given one last visit.

**David:** Our children's b'nai mitzvah are my fondest memories. My younger daughter was the first bat mitzvah to read from the Torah at Beth El – at a twilight service. **Steve:** My most notable memories, aside from family celebrations, were when Bobbie and I had the honor and privilege of meeting privately with Nobel Laureate Elie Wiesel in Rabbi Kahn's office, and on a separate occasion,

met with Abba Eban when he was a guest speaker at Beth El, pictured right with me & Bobbie. Also, we had the good fortune to host Rabbi Sam Lachs during the High Holidays for 17 consecutive years, at which time we became close friends, as he shared his insights about Judaism with us.



**Eric:** Beth El has been incredibly important to our family. For three generations, many of our closest friends are members and we have shared the most significant life events with our Beth El family both simchas and sadness. **Stuart:** Our daughter Robin attending Shabbat as an infant as well as Religious School through midrasha, our son Perry graduating from Kellman Academy, and celebrating both of their weddings and our granddaughter's baby naming in the beautiful main sanctuary on Chapel Ave.

#### What is your wish for the next 100 years?



**David:** To continue to grow and to change so that it remains relevant to the evolving Jewish community in the U.S. and throughout the world. We should be an agent of change; an innovator – not a follower. **Stuart:** My wish, and I'm joined by Judy, is that the synagogue grows from strength to strength and that the love and affection

that we have for it continues to be felt through the generations.

**Eric:** To continue to have a positive impact on lives just as it has for me and my family.

Linda: To continue the wonderful example it has set in the past and continue it into the future.

**Lynn:** I wish and pray that Beth El will continue to thrive, and that the younger generation continues the path set for them for the past 100 years.

**Steve:** I hope that in one-hundred years, Beth El continues to extend its positive influence of encouraging and instilling *Yiddishkeit* in our congregants and the Jewish community, and by that time would have established a Beth El annex in Israel, as our home away from home.

#### Memories from Long Time Member Selma Ellis



My husband, Bert Ellis, and I joined Beth El as Young Associates originals. However, my husband was a Bar Mitzvah. We joined Beth El because that was where our friends were. As a teenager, I went to Friday night services with friends and loved being there. Beth El served as a community center and hosted a dance every Saturday night with a Juke box. My oldest son (now 62) started

Sunday School at age 6 in a little house next to Beth El. Gerrie Ostroff was the teacher. Blanche Apothaker invited me to help in the kitchen preparing goodies for the Hebrew School. That hooked me into being involved in the Sisterhood (eventually becoming president). I remember Rabbi Kellman z"I telling us that the new Beth El was going to have a Menorah that reached the sky and indeed it did. I was part of many committees in the building of Beth El, including a committee chaired by Alan Cetron, that went to New York to select the Torah Plates that adorn the Torahs today. For many years, Beth El was a significant part of my family's life and I can't give you a favorite memory. They are all favorites. My wish for Beth El is to see its continued growth, success, and inclusion of everyone and be around another 100 years.
