#### Rabbi Andy Green

On the night of December 9, as numerous dedicated community members filed into our shul's Casino Royale evening, I found my way to my office, donned wig and sunglasses, jumpsuit and belt, tallis and varmulke, as I

transformed into "Rabbi Elvis." Over the course of the night. I renewed the vows of thirteen Beth EI couples, serenading them with the Elvis' sacred words of Can't Help Falling in Love with You, and having them promise to be their loved one's "hunka hunka burning love."

I'd be lying if I claimed that I wasn't at all hesitant about assuming this role, but when I realized that the essential character and holiness of the moments shared under our Beth El Chapel of Love chuppah, I couldn't refuse. Though surrounded by the trappings of Vegas shtick and an admittedly poor Elvis impersonator, the moments of greatest beauty and kindness that night happened not when I did anything, but those loving couples took time to rededicate themselves to one another, to laugh and kiss, to have and to hold, and to, under that chuppah, look deeply into the eyes of their spouses and recognize the image of Gd they are so privileged to behold and too often take for granted. Hand in hand (and with their whole hearts too), with bouquets and veils, these soulmates kissed and cried, blessed boreh pri hagafen, broke a glass, and signed their hearts to each other once again. Together we sang siman tov u'mazel tov, honoring this shared moment of love and intimacy, of caring and affirmation, of joy and humor.

In embracing both the sacred and the silly for this moment of significance, I followed what our congregation and what Conservative Judaism strives for, simultaneously holding on to both tradition and change, integrating ancient wisdom and practices with modern philosophies and circumstances. We take the approach in everything we do, whether considering the initial audience for a biblical narrative in our Torah Talk classes (every Saturday at 10:15am) or gathering together in Washington DC to reaffirm our ancient homeland and marvel at Israeli innovation (AIPAC Policy Conference, March 4-6) or revisiting our communal approach to welcoming interfaith families (January 24 at 7pm.) I hope you'll join us, as we reaffirm that Jewish wisdom, however ancient, has something deep to teach us as we respond to the vicissitudes and challenges and blessings that shape our lives.

## **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE - JOSH LASTER**



In early December, I attended my annual conference of synagogue administrators and executive directors. It's always a good chance to network with others that are in the same field, share our experiences with each other and most importantly learn together while attending the variety of workshops and seminars geared toward enabling us to serve as the Jewish communal professionals guiding our individual congregations. The theme of this year's conference was "Working for Today, Innovating for Tomorrow: The Ever-Evolving Role of Executive Directors".

I've attended many conferences over the years, and they have all offered valuable information that I could bring back for the improvement of my both myself and my synagogue. This conference impacted me in a different way. It spoke to the changing landscape in synagogues and the complicated dynamic of synagogue membership. We explored the opportunities for financial resources outside of the dues our families contribute each year. The speakers and participants shared innovative ideas for engaging those that are either on the

fringes of our own community or otherwise completely unengaged with their entire community. For me, all of this came back to two big questions: Why? and How?

These two questions leads to lots of other questions! Why do we do what we do? Why do our members belong to Beth El? Why do non-members choose to support us? How does Congregation Beth El serve as a beacon of Conservative Judaism in the South Jersey area? How do we raise awareness of the benefits we provide to our greater community? Why does our community need vibrant synagogues? How do we fit into the lives of the Jewish community that is not currently engaged with Beth El or any other synagogue?

These are big questions. As your executive director, I simultaneously feel confident answering these questions and at the same time cautiously aware that my answers may very well not be your answers. And yet, with these differences, we all very likely agree upon the importance of Beth El. We just need to understand the "why" and "how" so that we can help others who are not yet engaged or, perhaps, those are still part of Beth El but are currently less engaged than they were in other years.

In addition to attending this yearly conference, I look for inspiration from other resources as well. I'm a fan of listening and viewing TED Talks. For a taste of how truly engaging these talks are, Google "Simon Sinek Start with Why" (no caps needed). He is a powerful, speaker. I'm reasonably certain you will be inspired.

One of my most important ever-evolving roles as your executive director, is to help you connect with the organization you care so deeply about, assist you with connecting others to Beth El and make certain that we make clear not just the ways that you can support Beth El, but how we can support your as well. #### A Community Project

The beauty of a synagogue is that it has the power to bring together members of the congregational community across generational lines. We at Beth El strive to bring children, teens, and adults together to learn. Learning can take place during typical times or in alternative

spaces. The benefit of these types of experiences is the opportunity for our members to make new connections outside of their peer group within the congregational community.

In December, the entire community gathered together for Menorah Madness on the fifth day of Chanukah where members of all ages attempted to break the world record of lighting the most Chanukiyot at one time. Although we did not break the record we did have a wonderful time together singing songs and celebrating the lights of Chanukah as a community.

## BELL LIBRARY NEWS—AMY KAPLAN, CONGREGATION LIBRARIAN



The darkest days of winter can be illuminated by good books. Take advantage of cozy evenings at home and settle in with a selection from your synagogue library. Here are some suggestions:

#### Dorah Blume: Botticelli's Muse

Set in Renaissance Italy, this book will bring you into the world of renowned painter Sandro Botticelli at the time he was having problems with his patron, Lorenzo deMedici. On a visit to his sister's convent, he meets a Jewish woman, a weaver being held captive and forced to renounce her faith. Her beauty and artistry with flowers inspire Botticelli to

paint his masterpiece, "La Primavera," and he falls in love.

#### Nathan Englander: Dinner at the Center of the Earth

Englander (*For the Relief of Unbearable Urges, The Ministry of Special Cases*) blends genres in his latest novel. The central character, Prisoner Z, is in captivity at an unspecified location in the Negev. Another key figure, identified as the General, is in a coma; this character is a barely fictionalized Ariel Sharon. While the General lies dreaming of past exploits, Prisoner Z reminisces about his past experiences. The adventures these two men had take the reader across Europe and into historic moments with famous figures. Israeli history and politics receive a creative touch in this novel.

#### Alexandra Silber: After Anatevka

"Sunrise, Sunset," "Tradition," "If I Were a Rich Man" – these are the songs that make "Fiddler on the Roof" a modern classic. We walk out of the performance with these tunes in our heads. But what happens to the actors who live these roles for years? Alexandra Silber spent two years performing as Tevye's daughter Hodel in "Fiddler" in England. When she left the show, she needed to stay with the character, so she began writing about what happens to Hodel after she gets on a train to Siberia....and a novel was born. *After Anatevka* opens in a Siberian prison, where Hodel exchanges letters with her sister Tzeitel. Then husband Perchik, who is in a labor camp, comes into the story. The author spent three years writing the book, and her research included traveling to Siberia; she then was cast in the current Broadway revival of "Fiddler," this time as Tzeitel.

#### Gabrielle Zevin: Young Jane Young

Aviva, a 20-year-old intern, has an affair with a congressman (does this sound like a certain young woman in a blue dress? It's meant to...). When they are involved in a car accident, the affair becomes public. He makes the requisite apologies, but her life is destroyed by the publicity. What happens thereafter is cleverly related from five unique perspectives. One piece is told in the entertaining voice of Aviva's mother, an elderly South-Florida lady. Another uses the format of a choose-your-own –adventure story. While this all makes for an amusing read, the book is dead serious in its message that our society revels in "slut-shaming," to the detriment of women everywhere.
