In Israeli society today, it's not hard to pick out the Hasidim of Rebbe Nachman of Breslov (1772-1810, Ukraine.) Not only do they wear distinctive large knitted white kippot, but more than other Hasidic groups, they often play music and dance joyfully on the public square.

Part of this approach comes from one of the most famous teachings of Rebbe Nachman: mitzvah gedolah lihiyot b'simcha tamid, "it is a great mitzvah to be joyful always."

Interestingly, if you examine the Torah and any of the numerous rabbinic listings of the 613 mitzvot therein, you'll be hard pressed to find this mitzvah. For that matter, can Gd really legislate our emotions? Do we even have the capacity to constantly be filled with joy? Rebbe Nachman, who himself struggled with depression, certainly did not. Perhaps his statement was aspirational. Or perhaps, his statement can be understood another way.

The Torah does use both the terms "joy" and "always," simcha and tamid, in teaching about how too we can connect to Gd. Joy is commanded regarding the three times a year, Pesach, Shavuot, and Sukkot, when the Israelites would make pilgrimage to the Temple. The Torah tells us that surrounded by friends and holy community in the sacred city, the Jewish people would feel Gd's closeness and "be joyful," v'hayita ach sameach. Similarly, consistency is commanded in discussion of the tamid offering, the sacrifice brought before Gd each and every day at dawn, reminding the Jewish people through consistent ritual of Gd's special relationship with them.

What Rebbe Nachman does in combining these two elements of ancient practice, joy in communal pilgrimage and ritual consistency, simcha and tamid, is provide a recipe for spiritual success. Instead of reading his instruction to be joyous always, understand it as a suggested practice to enrich life and overcome challenge: each and every day travel to somewhere deliberate to be in fellowship with others and there, intentionally reflect in gratitude, practice mindfulness, and delight in the blessings of the day. That is, make a consistent pilgrimage to engage in community and rituals of joy. Or, in other words, come to shul.

Let Beth El be the place where you bring the wholeness of your presence regularly, where you strive to find and share deep inner joy. Let Beth El be the place where the brokenhearted go to receive a smile; the place where a person can offer words and feel "heard"; the place where someone suffering can find hope, healing, direction, and comfort. Let Beth El be your home for real prayer and for deep learning, at every stage and in every season.

In some congregational communities, the summer months represent a hiatus from activity; after all, school's out of session and many are traveling or down the shore. Not so at Beth El. All summer long, come together with our congregational family to embrace joy through the rituals that lift you. From our daily minyan to our splash pad, the swimming pool to the golf course, the ice cream parlor to the jungle gym, Beth El has what you need to feel your daily dose of joy each day this summer. I'll look forward to sharing a smile, a bite, a teaching, a blessing, and a laugh with you.



RABBI NOGAH MARSHALL, EDUCATIONAL DIRECTOR



In Judaism we are consistently re-telling the Jewish people's stories of survival. Whether it is from Egyptian slavery or the Syrian Greeks, the Jewish survival proves God's love and protection of the people of Israel. However, if you dig deeper into our history, the Jewish people did much more than survive.

The Jewish people revived by re-imagining their faith and identity. After the destruction of the First Temple, Jerusalem was revived by a group that returned to Zion from the Babylonian Exile, and after the destruction of the Second Temple, Judaism was revived once again by the creation of Jewish worship.

As we enter into the Summer season and the quickly approaching High Holy Day season, it is our turn, personally, and as a community, to revive our spirit and souls. At Congregation Beth El we are always looking to revive our programs and look into the future of our congregation. We seek to create programs that are captivating and inspiring.

We have an exciting new Hebrew High School Program planned for the coming year. Earlier in the year we sent out a survey to our current and incoming Hebrew High School students to see what days and times for Hebrew High School work for their children as well as what kind of classes they are interested in taking. We received wonderful feedback and are thrilled to offer exciting new elective classes to our students. All students in grades 7-10 attend Thursday evenings for core classes taught by Rabbi Aaron Krupnick, Rabbi Andy Green, Rabbi Gamliel Respes, Chai Respes. Jodi Bloch, Alan Kritz, and new this year Dorin Elhadad. Classes include Jewish Lifecycle. American Jewish History, B'nai Mitzvah Seminar, Shoah, Jewish Ethics, Israel History, Pirkei Avot, and Tanakh.

Students also attend a second day of Hebrew High School. We understand that your children have many commitments in addition to Hebrew High School, therefore, this year we are offering four different days to choose from for elective classes that will allow more flexibility with interest and schedule. We are offering electives on Saturday

and Sunday mornings, and Tuesday and Wednesday evenings.

- Saturday mornings: students will join Rabbi Green's weekly Torah Talk Class with Beth El members. Following the class students will attend the main Shabbat morning service as a group and enjoy Kiddush lunch as a community following services.
- Sunday mornings: students will have the opportunity to take the Project Teach Seminar and Practicum with Perri Silverstein. Students will volunteer as teaching assistants as well as a seminar with curriculum from the Matan Institute for Teens.
- Sunday mornings: we will also offer a Hebrew Intensive (year long course) with Tali Alfassy where students will study Modern Hebrew, vocabulary, and grammar through intensive study.
- Tuesday evenings: we will offer our traditional electives with Ellen Fine, Smadar Eisner, Cantor Leon Sher, Haleh Rabizadeh, and Anouk Backal. Electives include Jewish Cooking, Hot Topics, Jewish Yoga, Jewish Short Stories, Choir, Mitzvah Class, and more.
- Wednesday evenings: we will offer a class sponsored by the IAC (Israeli American Council) Media Room with Dorin Elhadad (9th/10th Grade Students-year long course). The Media Room's activities will be guided by volunteer mentors from our community who have domain expertise in research, journalism, technology and education. The mentors will guide an elite diplomacy team made up of student ambassadors (ages 16-24) from the greater South Jersey Jewish community. The team will develop Israel awareness campaigns and will react to local anti-Israel and BDS (Boycott, Divestment, Sanctions) activities. The team will also develop a network of activists from within the community who will take an active part in the Media Room's efforts.

I encourage all of you to take part in our revival and enroll your child into this exciting program and continue your Jewish journey with us here at Congregation Beth El. Have a wonderful summer.


