

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Beth El as your Favorite Charity

From time to time I have the opportunity to speak to philanthropists about including Beth EI in their plan for future charitable donations. Many times it is an easy discussion to have; sometimes it just takes a little longer to get my points across. For those less familiar with donating to a synagogue, questions sometimes arise in the nature of why a synagogue with a facility as beautiful as ours needs donations and the nature of the charitable work we do.

First and foremost, the beauty of our facility is appropriate for our mission to help in the service of Gd while helping to integrate, educate and elevate our members. What better tribute is there to Gd than to pray to Him in a beautiful house of worship. It is why we dress well and appropriately for services, why we stand when our ark doors are opened and why we cover our heads and act with a high degree of decorum when we enter Beth El.

Second, there is so much we do to help people. We work hard to have three daily minyans to inspire all and to comfort those who mourn. We have our Shabbat services with our unique and inspirational sermon series and often these services feature a Bar or Bat Mitzvah who have been trained through our education system. Our system works to educate the very young all the way to the not-so-young with our ECC, religious school, Hebrew high and adult education classes. We are working with the JFCS to teach professional restaurant skills to the developmentally disabled young adults through the Soups and Sweets program and we have the capability to teach younger special needs students who get personalized Bar and Bat Mitzvah programs. We help to feed the needy, connect with college students who are living away from home for the first time and run great programs for first time parents, long-time parents and all of us in between. And, if I had more space here I could continue and continue.

Let me assure you that many in our community recognize all we do to help. For example, in August, we received a very special gift from a Mt. Laurel church who closed its doors, sold its real estate and distributed the net proceeds from the sale to charities including Beth El. A copy of my thank you note follows:

Dear Mr. Schmutz,

Yesterday, Rabbi Aaron Krupnick opened his mail and received your congregation's generous donation of \$10,000. As a result, Rabbi got in touch with me and I called your attorney, Josele Finney who advised me your church had decided to cease operations and sold its real estate and the proceeds were being distributed to houses of worship in our area.

First, it is my honor as president of Beth El to accept your generous donation. We are receiving your gift just before the Jewish New Year (Rosh Hashana) and it is this time of the year that Jewish people throughout the world take an introspective look at our lives. 
The gift is being used to assist those members who have short-term financial difficulties and need financial assistance from Beth El.

Rabbi Aaron Krupnick **New Shoes** My Take on the Pew Study

The results of the Pew Study on Jewish Americans were published earlier this fall and the results present all of us who are committed to maintaining a meaningful and vibrant Judaism

with challenges and opportunities. Here are some of the results: The intermarriage rate, a bellwether statistic, has reached a high of 58 percent for all Jews and 71 percent for non-Orthodox Jews - a huge change from before 1970 when only 17 percent of Jews married outside the faith. Two-thirds of Jews do not belong to a synagogue, one-fourth do not believe in Gd and one-third had a Christmas tree in their home last year. Yet, at the same time, 94 percent (!) of all U.S. Jews say they are proud of being Jewish.

I take the fact that 94 percent of all American Jews are proud to be Jewish as an invitation to engage more of our people in Jewish life. To me it means that being Jewish makes them feel good about themselves. Now it's up to us, the committed core, to make sure that those who are unaffiliated and under-affiliated find open pathways to a more meaningful Jewish life here with us. It reminds me of a story my father z'l was fond of telling: Two men were sent to Africa at the turn of the last century to sell shoes to people still living in grass huts and walking around barefooted. One sent back a telegram saying, "Send ticket home. No one here wears shoes!" The next salesmen's telegraph to the boss read. "No one wears shoes! Bonanza! Send more shoes!"

I think that there are two ways of looking at this data and its implications for Beth EI: We can say, "Look, we are not for everyone, and our shul should be made up of people who share our values and commitment." Or we can say, "Let's lower the barriers as much as possible so that we can bring more people into our orbit and perhaps they will come to share our values and commitment in time." I believe in my heart that our purpose as a shul should reflect this second perspective. I think that this is what Judaism was and should always be about: Sharing a love of Jewish life, the joy of Jewish living and an enthusiasm for Jewish culture with as many Jews as possible. We need to meet our fellow Jews where they are at now; Integrate them into Jewish communal life, Educate them about what Judaism is all about and Elevate their spirits in the process. Bring 'em in, build 'em up and send 'em out. I think this should be our mission and I believe strongly that we should be a "mission-driven shul." That 94 percent number tells me that we need to better figure out the source of that pride, (which actually increases in younger cohorts) and bring those who feel it into closer orbit with our synagogue. We need to think deeply and clearly about what we can do to remove some of the barriers that might keep people away, while at the same time reaffirming the commitment of those who are already with us. We can capitalize on this overwhelming sense of pride that even the most assimilated Jews evidently feel. And, if our doors are open wide enough, we can bring more people across our threshold and every Jew can get a "new pair of shoes" right here at Beth El.

Dr. Hauptman's book *Rereading The Rabbis: A Woman's Voice (Radical Traditions)* Westview Press; Second Printing edition (November 21, 1997) provides a clear, scholarly and accessible study of the treatment of women in Talmudic legal interpretations, comparing these interpretations with the Torah itself.

The holidays made the beginning of the school year very busy. We celebrated them in full style as we ate apples and honey, made our own shofars, learned how to blow them and danced down the hall with the Torah. November is full of festivities as well with the newly-named Thanksgivukkah (Thanksgiving and Hanukkah). Latkes with your turkey, anyone?

Our January Twos class begins next month. This class, which meets for two hours, two days a week is a great opportunity to introduce your child to a warm, structured learning environment. The children cook, sing and make new friends in a cozy classroom with Allison Burkett Cook, our wonderful Parenting Place teacher.

We have also been busy planning new play spaces this summer and they will shortly be ready for the children to enjoy. The out-door space features inviting areas for dramatic play and large motor play, as well as science and discovery with our new gardens. Some of the new materials are designed specifically with our littlest students in mind and feature climbing toys made specifically for toddlers. Our indoor play space is filled with materials that allow children to be investigators and cultivate their problem solving and creative thinking skills.

Our play space is not the only innovative addition for this year. A new cooking and nutrition education program is beginning for our three year olds to introduce them to a wide variety of fresh fruits and vegetables. This program is part of a national study funded by the Pepsi Co. and our ECC is the first private school in the country to be invited to join the study. Our brand new garden will be very useful when the children are tasting and cooking a variety of fruits and vegetables. This program is in addition to our new Hebrew program in the older classrooms that teaches children vocabulary through songs and interactive language games.

BELL LIBRARY NEWS

Mystery and detective stories are among the most popular books in libraries. There's something richly satisfying about following a plot filled with twists and turns, all the while knowing that the end will bring resolution. The seemingly endless range of sub-genres within this genre - cozies, procedurals, historicals, etc. - means there really is something for every reader.

We have many mystery series in the Bell Library, by such favorite authors as Faye Kellerman (her just-released addition to the Decker/Lazarus series is The Beast) and Harlan Coben. There are also many fine stand-alone titles: here's a sampling of our newest additions:



For fans of historical mysteries, there's Patricia Royal's The Sanctity of Hate. This story takes us to Tyndal Priory in 1295 England. A Jewish family, passing through town, is accused when a local Christian man is murdered. In addition to being a fine mystery, this story offers a glimpse of Medieval England at the time of the Edict of Expulsion of its

Jewish population.

Another historical - this one with supernatural elements, is

Bristol House, by Beverly Swerling. Here Annie Kendall, a present-day architectural historian, in Bristol hired by the Shalom Foundation to search for Judaica from the time of the Second Temple; these artifacts were originally discovered by a Jewish man lin England at the time of King Henry VIII. Annie SWERLING rents a flat in London, where she begins receiving




"visits" from the ghost of a medieval monk. Joining forces with an investigative reporter (who looks like the monk), Annie tries to solve a present-day mystery with roots in the past. This is not the Pope, The Golem and the Jinni (respectively) simply a ghost story – it is a complex tale with strong elements of Jewish history.

Adele Rothstein is a feisty, attractive 75-year-old femme fatale who has buried three husbands. In Adele, The Rabbi's Mother: Book One, by Anna King, Adele joins forces with a young man from her son's congregation as they try to find out who brutally attacked the boy's mother. Adele and the other characters are well-drawn in this "cozy." It's a fun read – light and entertaining with an engaging story.



Delia Rosen also writes cozies. Her first book, A Brisket, A Casket: A Deadly Deli Mystery, is about Gwen Silver, who



inherits her uncle's Nashville Deli. When a customer dies while eating at the deli, the coroner says it's food poisoning, but Gwen suspects it's murder, and works with a police detective to learn the truth. Another "Deadly Deli Mystery" by Rosen, A Killer in the Rye, finds Gwen suspected of murder when her rush-order delivery of rve bread arrives and she discovers that the driver has died. These stories, with

their Southern setting, offer a fun, different spin on the amateursleuth story.
