## Setting the Bar

In one of the prayers we often recite at our Friday night service we say, "Torah is demanding, yet sweeter than honey, more precious than gold." And indeed,

Torah is very demanding. Judaism sets the bar high, expecting great things of us each and every waking hour of the day. In fact, the bar is set so high that it is inevitable that we fail to meet the mark. We fail to live up to our own standards, let alone Gd's. We fall prey to temptation. We give in to frustration, anger and cynicism. We act impulsively, saying and doing things that we wish we could do over. And that chasm between who we are and who we know we ought to be is never more obvious than on Rosh Ha-Shannah and Yom Kippur. Our faith, Judaism, sets the bar high. Maybe that's a reason they are called the "High Holidays," they are a reminder of how much higher we need to go.

On Yom Kippur, after ten days of soul searching and apologizing, Tradition gives us the chance to close the gap. We cannot live in a state of guilt forever. That's not healthy nor productive. Instead, Judaism gives us a mechanism, a day of fasting and reflection, for transmuting guilt into moral growth. The prayers we recite on that sacred day of reckoning remind us that the loving Gd created us in a spirit of forgiveness, knowing full well that the price of setting the bar high is our falling short from time to time. We are called upon not to lament our human frailty, but to recognize it, in ourselves and in others. As Gd forgives us (and Gd does!) so we learn to forgive others. As we pray that Gd will be

patient with our mistakes as they are reviewed, so we are called upon to be patient with others who have failed us. As we prayer for rapprochement, we try to find the courage to do that for relationships we know are in need of repair.

For many, this has been a challenging and contentious year. But on the High Holidays we indeed get a do-over. We have the opportunity to come together as one big, boisterous family. These holy days remind us that we are, every single one of us, created in the image of Gd. That sacred and holy part of each of us is hidden, but undeniable. I hope that when you come to shul this Yuntif you feel the presence of the Shechinah, the aura of holiness that fills the room. Here, all around you, are people who want to do more, to be more, and to never stop growing. They are there to pray to Gd for help in doing so. And we are there to remind us that we might be the ones to help them get that much closer to feeling Gd, and goodness in their lives.

We are human; we fail, and fall, and get back up again, and then fail and fall again. But we are also part of a sacred community, here to lift up one another. We should never lower the bar, but at the same time, we should be more than willing to help others reach higher, for in the process we rise up as well. May this be an uplifting, inspiring and fulfilling High Holy Days for all of Beth El.



In just a matter of days we will be entering into the High Holy Day season. At the end of the season on Simchat Torah, we complete the Five Books of Moses. When we complete the Torah we recite a special phrase, "Chazak Chazak Venitchazek." "Be strong, be strong, and together we will be

strengthened." At first glance the word "Chazak" appears to be of importance, but in fact what is so meaningful is the use of the word "together." "Venitchazek," together we will be strengthened. The entire Jewish people finishes the book of the Torah as a community together but immediately begins it again, a new chapter and book by starting from the beginning again.

We as a synagogue family also begin every year a new chapter, a new book in our lives with new stories together. We hope that you will make some of your new stories with us here at Congregation Beth El by joining us for one or all of our exciting programs.

As we begin a new year, we will be offering a new program on Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur for our children in grades K-6. On the first day of Rosh Hashanah we welcome The Bible Players to Congregation Beth El. The Bible Players are a Torah comedy team based in New York City that are teaching Jewish values and sweeping the nation! The Bible Players use theater and improv to infuse comedy and laughs into tales from the Torah and beyond. It's Back to School 2018 and we are preparing even more exciting and innovative programming for our young learners. After such a successful 2017, please allow me

to recap some of the highlights.

- Many more families have joined our Beth EL ECC Family which allowed us to open new classrooms keeping to our gold standard of low class sizes.
- Our staff has grown too and I am proud to say that we have Rock Star Teachers and Awesome Assistants.
- We added a parent communication app that allows you to be a part of your child's day in real time. Who doesn't love those wonderful pictures of your children when you are at work?
- Our holiday events are always a big hit with families and you can see our pictures and videos on our Facebook page.
- We added Prayers in Pajamas on Friday nights which is also a big hit.
- We offered special area classes that included Physical Education, Art, Music, Library, and classes with the Rabbi.
- Afterschool and afternoon programming included Mini Sports, Mini Soccer, Dance, Art, Karate, Bricks 4 Kids, Cooking, Baking, Mad Science, Bricks, Beakers, & Bots, Art Enrichment, and Computers.
- Safety and security is of the utmost importance and we continue to review our procedures to provide the very best security measures.

New in 2018, thanks to our fabulous Parent Teacher Group, we will be launching our new STEAM initiative. STEAM is an educational approach to teaching and learning that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics for guiding student inquiry and discovery. As students engage in hands-on activities they are empowered to develop essential skills such as problem solving, critical and creative thinking, communication, collaboration, innovation, and perseverance. The overarching goal is to blend project-based platforms that help our students understand, interpret, and utilize fundamental concepts to solve real-world problems. We are excited to offer this program to all of our students, Infants through Kindergarten.

Another new outreach and programming is with the Israeli American Council (IAC). Our partnership with the IAC will provide staff development for our teachers, books and curriculum for our students, meetings for families, and theatrical productions for all to enjoy.

New to our afterschool programming are the Hebrew Club, Yoga, Robotics, and Coding. These clubs have been requested and will round out our offerings to a total of 16 clubs or classes.

## BELL LIBRARY NEWS—AMY KAPLAN, CONGREGATION LIBRARIAN


The library is open once again and we have lots of terrific books to keep you reading.

Ready for something new? Here are a few you'll find on our "New Fiction" shelves:

Gregory Blake Smith's **The Maze at Windermere** is unique. The author sets the novel in Newport, R.I. at five different times in American history, he creates five different plotlines to go with those historic moments, he writes each section in a style appropriate to that period, and he brings it all together through shared themes and details. One story is set in the


present day, one in 1896, one in 1863, one in 1778, and one in 1692. The story set in 1778 has a wealthy Jewish family whose daughter catches the eye of a ruthless British officer. As Smith walks us through the different eras, alternating among them, we see that attitudes and behaviors may be timeless. This is a brilliantly imagined and beautifully executed novel.






Viewers of CNN know Jake Tapper as the network's chief Washington correspondent. For almost twenty years he has reported in Washington DC, so he knows politics. Now he has turned his attention to writing, and his first novel is **The Hellfire Club**, set in 1950s DC. Charlie Marder is not a born politician. Marder is a WWII veteran who is comfortable in academia, but his ambitious father uses connections and gets Charlie elected to Congress. Like many newly elected representatives, his desire to do what is ethical and in the best interests of his constituents bumps up against some harsh realities as he deals with McCarthyism and such figures as Roy Cohn. A fatal car accident puts Marder and his wife in a sordid underworld where there are secret societies, unsavory deals, and a dangerous conspiracy. If you like politics, and enjoy a page-turning thriller, try this one.

The idea that there are people in the American Southwest today who are descendants of converso Jews from 500 years ago is intriguing. Some say it's a fact, others deem it doubtful, but whatever your view, Mary Morris's **Gateway to the Moon** is captivating. This novel has two parallel narratives: one tells the story of a secret Jew named Luis de Torres who sails with Columbus; the other is the story of Miguel Torres, a teenager living in present-day Entrada de la Luna, a 400-year-old town in New Mexico where residents are the descendants of de Torres. Miguel takes a job babysitting for a nearby, newly arrived Jewish family and sees similarities between their rituals and the long-standing, never explained customs of the locals. The long and vicious arm of the Inquisition, as well as Columbus's own cruelty toward the native population, are described graphically in the sections about de Torres. Morris's descriptions of the history, landscapes, and people are vivid and hold the reader's attention.







