This is why our Endowment Team led by Steven Eisner, Neal Cupersmith, Joceyln Borowski, Victor Levy and David Backal have worked so tirelessly to ensure that the new Beth El Endowment Program will succeed.

Recently, you received a letter which Steven and I signed along with a copy of our Endowment brochure. I wanted to take this opportunity to answer some questions about endowments which may have arisen.

An Endowment Program is not a source for immediate or short-term funding. As a result, we will still have to rely upon our generous Beth El community to pay dues, attend fund raisers, buy scrip and otherwise support Beth El. However, an Endowment Program is a wonderful opportunity to ensure the long-term growth and vibrancy of our shul. We all want to preserve Beth El for the future to make sure that our

tangible heirlooms (such as our plaques and photographs) as well as our less tangible, but more important memories always have a home. You may be contacted by a Beth El volunteer with a request to join our many members who have committed to our Endowment Program. Please consider coming aboard this ship to ensure our financial success.



Rabbi Aaron Krupnick **Assimilating Wisely**

Most of the time when we Jews hear the word "assimilate" it has negative connotations, but I don't think that's always the case. Jews have always learned from the world around us. and we have contributed a great deal to it as well. I

believe that the challenge of Judaism – in every age – is learning the art of assimilating wisely. We have too much to offer the world to be tucked away in isolated pockets with no access to the outside world. For instance, our Jewish sense of social justice and equality propelled the Civil Rights movement forward in our country. Recently, I was watching a program on the assassination of President Kennedy and it referenced Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Most people don't realize that Martin Luther King spoke to the Rabbis of the Conservative Movement the week before he was assassinated and thanked my predecessors for carrying the cause along with him. That's probably why he referenced Jews first in his "I Have a Dream Speech" when he spoke of people living in harmony. But it's not just our sense of social justice that is vital to the world: Jewish creativity in the arts and in culture has helped to make the world a more beautiful place; our impact in the realm of science has saved countless lives. Jews, a small sliver of the world's population, have accounted for more than 20% of all Nobel Prizes awarded. Jews who lived cloistered lives did not, and do not have that kind of influence.

Yes, it is true that fewer Jews are maintaining Jewish law, fewer are marrying Jewish people, and raising Jewish kids - and most importantly, less Jewish people describe themselves as "religious". Sometimes assimilation is a threat. That is precisely why we need to assimilate wisely.

When have you assimilated too far? When you feel that you have nothing to offer the cause of the Jewish People. The world needs all kinds of "religious" Jews - observant of Jewish law and not: Jews who can read Hebrew and Jews who cannot; Jews who are moved by sitting in synagogue, and Jews who live their spirituality in other ways; Jews who are politically active and not; the list goes on and on... Judaism is a broad spectrum of belief and practice. We need to understand, and to get our children to understand, that each of us - each of them, has something precious to contribute in moving Judaism forward - that we are an evolving civilization made up of "Religious Jews". And if your Judaism shapes and informs your life, if your religion shapes your self-concept - you ARE "religious" and you have something important to contribute to our growth as a People. Each of us has something precious to contribute. And that means always walking the fine line between being citizens of the world and yet standing apart from it as well. But it starts with pushing deeper; asking ourselves just what our Judaism means to each of us and the way it shapes our lives. We need to articulate to ourselves and to others the values and practices, the beliefs and customs that shape our lives. And we can't always do so on our own. We need to read and study and learn what Judaism is all about. By doing so we not only gain a deeper understanding of ourselves, but we help our children and grandchildren to do the same. Judaism is an evolving civilization and we are the ones who will move it forward.

When I became a bar mitzvah many years ago, I received a hardcover edition of the Hebrew Bible in English, published by the Jewish Publication Society. But with no Hebrew, and more importantly, no commentary, I don't think I ever used it.

That's why I'm so proud that Congregation Beth EI, through the generosity of the Beth EI Sisterhood, has been giving the gift of the Etz Hayim chumash (Torah) to our b'nai mitzvah students, the same chumash that is in the sanctuary. However, for cost reasons, we've been giving a small version of it, with print that sometimes requires a magnifying glass.

After some reflection and feedback, Rabbi Krupnick and I decided to make a change, and with the very generous support of Sharon and Adam Sackstein, as well as with the help of the Sisterhood, we are now presenting students with the Stone Chumash, published by Artscroll. This chumash has a tremendous amount of commentary that brings insights from the Talmud, from midrash, and from many ancient, medieval and modern sages. This is a chumash that students can use throughout their lives as teens and adults, and that they can grow with. Indeed, it is a chumash I consult almost every week!

I am so grateful to Sharon and Adam Sackstein for this gift to our youth, and for their vision and support. Additionally, Adam and Sharon have set up the **Sackstein Family B'nai Mitzvah Chumash Fund**, which is open to contributions, and will help fund the gift of chumashim for our b'nai mitzvah students for many years to come. BELL LIBRARY NEWS Amy Kaplan - Congregation Librarian


time for catching up on some reading. Our shelves are filled with new novels by new authors as well as familiar, favorite writers -- and we have some surprises, too!

Naomi Ragen is the American-Israeli, Orthodox and sometimes controversial author of several international best-sellers. Her new book, The Sisters Weiss, tells the story of Rose and Pearl Weiss, who grow up in an ultra-Orthodox

home in 1950s Brooklyn. Rose becomes an outcast due to a serious transgression. Forty years later, Pearl's daughter Rivka learns the truth about her Aunt Rose and sets off on a dangerous adventure. This story of loyalty and betrayal will satisfy readers who enjoyed Ragen's previous works, such as Jephte's

Daughter, Sotah and The Sacrifice of Tamar.

We don't often read about the Jews of South Africa, but Kenneth Bonert's new novel, The Lion Seeker, takes us deep into the history and culture of this land. In this very ambitious book,



keep readers riveted.

In Freud's Mistress, authors Karen Mack and Jennifer Kaufman speculate about what may have occurred between Sigmund Freud and his sister-in-law Minna Bernays. This intriguing historical novel follows Minna as she loses her job and moves in with her older sister Martha Freud. Sigmund's wife, to

> help run the household and care for the Freuds' six children. Martha was not receptive to some of her husband's ideas, but Minna found them fascinating. Minna and Sigmund developed an intellectual bond, but factual details about how far their relationship went are sketchy. The authors speculate about the "affair" between Minna and Sigmund, while bringing

fin de siècle Vienna to life, depicting both high society and the servant class.

And in the "surprise" department: Would you believe Nicholas Sparks (yes, that Nicholas Sparks, mega-bestselling author of such books as The Notebook) has written a new novel that fea-

> tures two couples - one of whom is Jewish?! Yes, The Longest Ride tells the story of Ira and Ruth Levinson (the Jewish couple, of course). Ira, stranded after a car crash, struggles to remain conscious. His deceased wife Ruth appears to him and urges him to hang on, recounting stories of their life together. Not too far away, Sophia, a college student recovering

from a recent breakup, meets cowboy Luke and these two very different young people fall in love. How do the stories of these two couples converge? Read The Longest Ride (have some tissues handy; after all, this is Nicholas Sparks) and find out!

These may be the "shortest" days of the year, but More and more gluten-free products are appearing on superthe long, dark evenings of winter are the perfect market shelves and on restaurant menus. If you are looking for



recipes to fit a gluten-free lifestyle, take a look at Nosh On This, Gluten-Free Baking from a Jewish-American Kitchen, by Lisa Stander-Horel and Tim Horel. From crackers to danish, brownies to creamfilled éclairs, this beautifully illustrated cookbook will help you create crowd-pleasing breads and desserts.

Anyone who spends any time driving (well, that's just about everyone) can take advantage of our audio book collection. Pop a CD in and enjoy a novel while commuting or running errands. Our newest audio books are:

The Paris Architect by Charles Belfoure. Written by an architect, this story imagines a French architect, Lucien Bernard, in Paris during WWII. Though not sympathetic to the plight of the French Jews, Bernard, through a series of events, ends up designing secret hiding places for them. Lots of period detail and local color in this one! (We also have the print edition.)



Jacob's Oath by Martin Fletcher. In the aftermath of WWII, Jacob and Sarah, Holocaust survivors who met in Heidelberg, are among the 20 million refugees walking home. Jacob is
