Rabbi Aaron Krupnick Continuity in Changing Times

Hebrew is a most marvelous language; one that reflects our Philosophy of Jewish Life. Take for instance, the phrase most repeated during this High Holiday season, "Shannah Tovah." Paradoxically, the Hebrew word for "year," Shannah, comes from a root that means two apparent opposites: 'to change' and 'to repeat'. On the surface the two are wholly incompati-

ble: either things change or they repeat again and again... How can one word have such different con-notations? It's because Judaism believes that life is an endless combination of both. Repetition and change - the two exist in our lives simultaneously and, ideally, compatibly as well. On the one hand there are certain cycles; the holidays, the seasons, the words of fixed prayer, that all repeat themselves endlessly. The familiarity, the frequency, the fluency of these cycles bring continuity and contentment to our lives. We crave the familiar. On the other hand, we neither believe in our hearts, nor truly hope intellectually that life will never change. Change is so often for the better. We have yet to reach our full potentials. Things change, sometimes subtly, and at times more profoundly because we are growing; time presses ever forward. In essence, whether we choose to acknowledge it or not, and change. We don't want to be we desire both continuity tortured by endless cycles of monotony, and yet we fear the unknown that is yet to be. It is for this very reason that our Tradition provides us with resources that enable us to appreciate the beauty of both change and repetition.

Judaism's recipe for success in changing times is summed up by the three words that are the focus of our prayer during these Holy Days: "Teshuvah," "Tefillah" and "Tzedakah." Teshuvah, repentance, means that in an uncertain world we are all bound to make mistakes. But, when we acknowledge them, apologize and resolve to do better next time, we can begin to move on and restore our sense of inner balance. Our world may have changed, but we learn soon enough to adjust to the new normal. Tefillah, prayer, means simply that we are not alone. Gd accompanies us on our journey to our unknown destination, supporting us when we falter, reassuring that there is a long-term plan at work. Prayer helps us eventually find that peaceful path. Tzedakah, charity and justice, means that we are here to help those who suffer as a result of change, and that in so doing, we find our eternal inner core as well. Counterintuitively, by helping others through change we find stability in our own lives.

Judaism is our internal compass, showing us the direction even when we lack a map. It is no coincidence that the holiest object in Judaism is a Sefer Torah, something portable. In the tabernacle and Temple, the carrying poles were never removed from the ark so that the Torah was always ready to accompany the Israelites even if they had to move suddenly. Jews have long known insecurity and we are prepared for it. For though the world changes our values do not. Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, the two festivals of time itself, are an education in how to face the future without fear.

KOL NIDRE APPEAL

L'dor v'dor. From generation to generation. As Jews, we take these words seriously, and we are all familiar with them in the prayers we recite. But, these words have special meaning to me on Kol Nidre- and it is one of the reasons Julie and I embraced the opportunity to chair the Kol Nidre appeal. Let me share my story.

My dad, Bruce, passed away 4 years and 6 months ago, on February 28, 2011. He was only 63 years old, but secondary progressive MS had ravaged his body years before. He was bedridden the last 5 years of his life. Despite the terrible hand he was dealt in life, he never lost his faith in G-d, and being Jewish was at the core of his identity. I have vivid memories growing up in Long Island and walking to synagogue with my dad on the high holidays; when I was in my early twenties and my dad was wheelchair bound, I would push him the mile to our shul. Giving this even more meaning was that I knew, more than any other prayer, my dad loved Kol Nidre. In fact, when Rabbi Jeff eulogized my dad, Kol Nidre was at the heart of his words:

"Kol Nidre is pefect for Bruce because it seems like it looks backwards at the year that's past. After all, it's the day of reviewing our past. In fact though, Kol Nidre is about the year to come. We pray that our vows be annulled in the year to come so that we can look forward to it with a clean slate...On Yom Kippur, when we should be looking back in fear of all we may have done. we start by looking forward and expressing our gratitude for every moment we've had. We thank God for life and look to the future rather than the past. That is Bruce's prayer. For here is a man who had every right to look back on his life and see the cards he was dealt and to quit and stop fighting, but that wasn't Bruce. Bruce continually looked forward and was grateful for every moment he had in life and clung to life fiercely. Why? To see his future, to hear about the accomplishments of his children, to see his grandchildren grow and hear them say "Poppy Bruce."

Kol Nidre has a special meaning for me, providing an opportunity to remember and connect with my dad, and to tell my children about their Poppy Bruce. L'dor v'dor. From generation to generation. And that is why we have always given to the Kol Nidre appeal, and Julie and I hope you are able to, too. Not only does it connect us with past generations, who for millennia have been in synagogue to hear Kol Nidre, but it ensures Beth El will be able to be there for the future, for our children and grandchildren.





September in July



While visiting family in Paris in July and enjoying this view, I wonder how can I be inspired to write an article for the September/ October BEN about the ECC.

This probably is the only time a picture of Paris France will appear in our ECC section, until of course, we come up with a plan to take our

teachers to Reggio Emilia in Italy with a stop over in Paris.

As I prepare to assume my position as the ECC director I spend a lot of time reading and contacting people who are at the cutting edge of early childhood education.

There are three terms in childhood education that I kept hearing throughout my conversations with all those experienced educators: Reggio Emilia, Emergent Curriculum and Loose parts. These are three terms that I hope will be part of many conversation we will have among our educators and also with you, the parents.

Reggio Emilia - A city in Italy and also the birth place of a philosophical approach to early childhood education. It is based on the principles of respect, responsibility, and community through exploration and discovery in a supportive and enriching environ-

ment based on the interests of the children through a self-guided curriculum

Emergent curriculum - a curriculum that supports the Reggio Emilia approach. A curriculum constantly evolving in response to children's changing needs and interests, parental and community interests and concerns, and teachers' priorities. Each of these key elements shapes the direction for future learning.

Loose parts - while in Israel early this year, I visited kibutz Sdeh Eliyahu in northern Israel. The birth place of "The Junk Yard approach to early childhood education". Here in the USA this approach adopted a more positive term: "Loose Parts" - alluring, beautiful, found objects and materials that children can move, manipulate, control, and change while they play. Children can carry, combine, redesign, line up, take apart, and put loose parts back together in almost endless ways. The materials come with no specific set of directions, and they can be used alone or combined with other materials. Children can turn them into whatever they desire. Loose parts offer many possibilities for open-ended learning. Loose parts support the acquisition of skills such as math, science, language and literacy, art, and movement that children are required to demonstrate when they enter kindergarten.


The word - שנה - shanah - year in Hebrew means change. As we celebrate the beginning of a new year that we know will be a changed, different kind of a year, my hope is that our experiences as we explore the above new three elements together, will be an enriching one. Stay tuned to more information about them. Ask us questions. Tell us your thoughts.





Hoffman, Alice: *The Marriage of Opposites*. Historical fiction fans and art lovers won't want to miss this one. Hoffman, author of the widely acclaimed *The Dovekeepers*, brings us a brand new novel sure to please. This is the story of Rachel, who grows up on the island of St. Thomas in the early 1800s. A willful girl, she is married off to a widower with three children in an effort to bolster the family's financial situation. When her husband dies suddenly, his handsome, much younger nephew arrives from France, and a passionate affair begins. The scandal that ensues has repercussions on her family, including her favorite son – Camille Pisarro, the famed father of Impressionist art.



Landau, Adam. *The Empire of the Senses*. Landau's first novel follows one family through two wars. Lev Pearlmutter is an assimilated Jew living in Berlin with his German gentile wife. Initially wanting to shed himself of his Jewish identity, he enlists when World War I breaks out, and falls in love with Leah, a poor Jewish Russian peasant. After the War, Leah's nephew arrives in Berlin and falls in love with Lev's daughter, Vicki. Lev also has a son, Franz, who is finding it increasingly difficult to conceal his homosexuality. And, Lev's wife Josephine Is engaged in more than just counseling with her therapist. This novel blends history and romance for an engrossing story with strong characters.



Pogregin, Letty Cottin. *Single Jewish Male Seeking Soul Mate*. Assimilation is a theme in this timely novel by one of the founders of Ms. Magazine. Zach Levy is the son of Holocaust survivors. A successful New York attorney, Zach promised his dying mother that he would marry a Jewish woman. Zach's first wife is Jewish, and they have a daughter. When his wife leaves him, he begins the search for his next Jewish wife. An affair with a comically bizarre Jewish woman ensues, but when that fails, Zach again renews his search in earnest. Attending a community meeting, Zach meets Chloe, the beautiful – and black – host of a successful radio program. Zach and Chloe are drawn to each other, and Zach must confront his dilemma: marry Chloe, who is the woman he loves, or continue to honor his mother's dying wish. Pogrebin captures the zeitgeist of young, hip NY, and the novel is an easy read, but serious issues are presented.

Sam Asbell has very generously created and dedicated a collection of rare and antique Jewish books in our Library in memory of his beloved wife, Susan. The Susan Asbell Collection includes Biblical, philosophical, historical and other categories of content. Seeing and holding these books, some of which are hundreds of years old, is a tangible reminder of our precious Jewish legacy. Todah rabah to Sam for this very special memorial collection.
