Something magical happened in our sanctuary the night of May 24, 2017. Our sold out *Every Voice Gala Concert*, celebrating Hazzan Pomerantz-Boro's installation as the International President of the

Cantors Assembly, rocked the house.

The concert began with the voices of over 200 Cantors singing two stunning and distinctive renditions of Psalm 150. Later, Hazzan's sister, Raquel Pomerantz Gershon, sang a moving Anim Zemirot that she composed for just this occasion. Rabbi Eli Kahn had us singing along with his Hayom duet, that we can all look forward to this coming High Holiday season. The "Divas on the Bima" crooned an elevating Kol HaOlam followed by Defying Gravity from "Wicked". "The Clergy Boys" roasted our Hazzan with sweetness, humor, and songs that evidently pre-date my musical knowledge. "Joyful Noise," a heart-nourishing special-needs chorus featuring Rebecca Boro and others from our synagogue community, brought the crowd to tears and then to their feet for a worthy standing ovation, reflecting our Hazzan's commitment to ensuring a place for truly Every Voice. Other performances further showcased a profound depth of talent and breadth of approach: Dodi Li with four awe-inspiring female hazzanim, one of whom was Hazzan's Bat Mitzvah student years ago; Azi Schwartz' unreal "Hamilton" Adon Olam; Hazzan's solo; The Prayer, a duet with

David Propis, authored by Hazzan's father; Cantor Sher's worthy finale commissioned especially for this concert; and Hazzan's Modim, which she composed in the hospital when Rebecca was born.

On this special evening, years of planning and the work of hundreds of volunteers came to fruition in the most magnificent way. By the end of the night, my father who had flown in from Los Angeles for the concert, was ready to book for the next one. People left the evening smiling and uplifted, impressed at how much more it was than expected. I think this is because this concert wasn't merely a show or a transactional experience like going to a concert or the theater typically is. We were moved because the experience reminded us that at Beth El we are family – that we are connected in relational community.

I felt this toward the start of the concert when Rabbi Krupnick shared how when he first heard Hazzan Alisa Pomerantz-Boro at a Cantorial concert, he imagined how amazing Beth El could be by asking "if she could be our Hazzan, what would our shul be like?" He held up his hands looking to the throngs filling our sacred space and turned to our Hazzan, "Like this." The moment reminded me just how special our community is, that the community needs each of us and that we are part of something deep, enduring, holy, and much larger than ourselves.

My soul stirred again when our Hazzan's own Beth El students as young as seven years old, gloriously sang "I'm standing on the shoulders of the ones who came before me." As Ariel Steinberg, Sara Chesnick, Ali Chesnick, Allison Shapiro, and Melissa Lubars masterfully performed, a Torah recovered from the ashes of the Holocaust, passed from one former president of the Cantors Assembly to another until it reached our Hazzan who placed it in our sanctuary ark. The message of the song, that each of us depends on our teachers and predecessors, fit deeply in so many ways: Hazzan's term as International President of the Cantors Assembly will reflect the work of prior presidents; this Holocaust Torah reminds us how previous generations persevered to ensure the our privilege to participate in Jewish communal life; and these student singers, with voices of angels, too, were shaped by Hazzan and by our Beth El family, by those who came before them.

Sometimes it is important to be reminded of the blessing and joy of Jewish community. This magical night renewed my gratitude and awe for our Beth El family. I hope you feel the magic too.

I am still on Cloud 9 from our **Every Voice Gala Concert** at our beloved Beth El! I continue to feel blessed by the love and support of my family and friends who came from places near and far to share in my installation as the International President of the Cantors Assembly and to celebrate my 13 years as your Hazzan. The outpouring of calls, emails, letters, and thoughtful comments continually remind me how blessed we are to be part of our awesome community.

The idea of **Every Voice** is very important to me...I have shared my thoughts about each one of us finding and using our voice in meaningful ways.

It was powerful to hear 200+ voices of my colleagues join me on our *bima* alongside our Beth El Adult Choir and HaZamir South Jersey. Watching and hearing Joyful Noise perform **You Have A Heart** was another meaningful way to spread this message. Having my inspirational daughter, Rebecca, singing a solo, was an added bonus! One of the many highlights of the night for me was placing the precious, kosher, Holocaust survivor Torah into our magnificent ark.

According to Deuteronomy, every Jew is supposed to write a Torah for themselves before they die. Not all of us will have the opportunity to do so, but we all can learn from the many Torah scrolls within our community. Each Torah has its own story.

The Cantors Assembly President's Torah also has a story. An Israeli businessperson living in Germany made a trip as a tourist to a little town outside of Poland. He was an antique collector visiting a store when he noticed a parchment from a Torah. The businessperson asked the dealer, "What is this?" The dealer responded, "Are you Jewish?" The man said "yes" and the dealer then said, "If you are Jewish, I can tell you." He locked the front door of the store and asked the man to follow him.

The dealer went with the man to see an old woman, a non-Jew, who, before the Shoah, was a nanny in a wealthy Jew's home, wealthy such that he could afford a Sefer Torah for his own *ha'na'ah*, enjoyment. The Nazis were moving in and the wealthy man knew he and his family would be taken away. He asked the nanny to protect this Torah so she carefully buried it in her backyard where it remained for decades.

The Israeli businessman was the first Jewish person to cross her path all of these years later. Now, the question was how to get the Torah out of Poland. The Communist controlled Polish government considered it national property and chances were they would never let the Torah out of their country. (continued page 3)

The businessman recalled the heroine of the movie, "The French Connection." They dissembled the Torah, piece by piece, and hid all of the pieces strategically inside the empty spaces of his car: inside the doors, the fenders, under the hood. When they were safely out of Poland, they reassembled the Torah.

This little Torah, hiding no more, did a little more traveling. It found safe shelter at *Yad VaShem*, Israel's Holocaust Memorial Museum. There it rested for some years before it was acquired by someone who would restore its letters, heal its parchment and bring its songs back into the world. The little Torah found the Cantors Assembly through the efforts of two of our past presidents, Hazzanim Sol Mendelson, *zichrono livracha*, and Steven Stoehr. An agreement was made to purchase the Torah, preserve it and USE it amongst the community of Cantors Assembly's Congregations. It would reside in the Ark of the current President of the Cantors Assembly's this sacred scroll.

I have seen many Holocaust Torah fragments encased in glass in other synagogues. I have seen entire Torah scrolls in museums. What makes this Cantors Assembly Torah so meaningful to me is that we are able to chant from it! In this way, we can still hear **Every Voice**, including the voices of those who came before us, keeping their memories alive. At a recent B'not Mitzvah, both young women chanted from this Torah. As I watched them pass the scroll one to the other, it was a moving reminder of our lasting legacy. We continue to stand on the shoulders of those who came before us, knowing that others will stand on ours.

I would like to close with a *kavanah* written by the talented contemporary Jewish musician and composer, Josh Nelson.


Take a moment, and look at your own hands.

These hands do not belong only to you. These are not just your hands.

These are the hands of our parents and our grandparents, and these are the hands of our children and our grandchildren. These hands hold on to the past, and these hands help us shape the future."

We are not alone on this road we walk. We are carried by the generations that came before us, just as we will carry the generations that are to come. This is our hope. This is our connection. Look at your hands.

While the Holocaust Torah itself will ultimately be passed to my successor, I am thrilled that the new Torah mantle in honor of our own Jerome M. Katz will remain in our ark as a lasting legacy.



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE - JOSH LASTER



So I'll let you in on a little secret. I'm not from New Jersey. My family is from Pennsylvania. As a matter of fact, the last synagogue I worked in was in Central Jersey (it does exist), and when my wife and I discussed moving to that area, we decided that we would rather stay where we were in Chester County, Pennsylvania, because there just didn't seem to be a compelling reason to move to that large piece of land in between Pennsylvania and the Atlantic Ocean. When my wife and I began considering the position of Executive Director at Beth EI, we realized that without a doubt the Lasters would have to move to "the other side of the bridge". We had heard lore from our South Jersey friends about the magical Jewish land of the Cherry Hill area, but had never considered moving here. Now we were in a position where we were seriously considering what it would mean for our family to move, to be from...New Jersey!

There were many conversations that led up to the decision to accept an offer from Beth El to be your Executive Director. Erica and I spent many hours hashing out the pros and cons of relocating to Cherry Hill. Great home selection, reputable school districts, closer to the shore, close to Philly, and above all else – the Jewishness of the area seemed to be in the fabric of daily living. We decided to go for it. We wanted that kind of life for our family. So many houses we looked at had a mezuzah on the doorposts of the homes (and some upon the gates). We passed at least one synagogue, if not four, on each of our visits to the area as we were considering homes. This was the right decision. The prevalence of synagogues played a huge role in our decision to move here, and I would dare say that it has likely influenced every person that has moved to this area looking for a strong Jewish community.

This Jewish community would not be what it is without the roots of what caused it to flourish – communities that started in synagogues. Synagogues created friendships, forged long lasting relationships and engaged Jewish communities in religious, social and cultural ways that would not just happen by living in a neighborhood with a lot of Jewish people. I understand that there is real struggle these days as some Jews struggle with justifying belonging to a synagogue, sometimes asking themselves what they "get from their membership" or believing they don't need to belong somewhere to be Jewish. That's true. Being Jewish isn't tied to belonging anywhere. But living Jewishly is. To me, it's simple. If you live in this area because it's a Jewish area, you should belong to a synagogue. For some, it might not seem as relevant to life today, but this area would not be what it is without these houses of worship, these gathering spaces, these educators of the next generations of Jewish families, these connectors. And connection is what it's all about, right?

We just returned from the Beth El Young Families Group Retreat. There were 15 families from Beth El, and we had an amazing time together – in meals, in worship, and in recreational activities. We laughed, we bonded, we hung out, we shared, we connected – it was awesome. We felt, as a family, that true sense of community and what belonging to a synagogue does to enrich our lives. I have zero doubt that my family made the right decision to be (gulp) from New Jersey.

So if you know someone that doesn't belong to a synagogue, someone that "used to belong to a synagogue", challenge them a little bit (just a little bit). Invite them to services, bring them to a program, have them over for Shabbat dinner with some of your Beth El friends and help them feel connected. Jewish people live in this area to be connected to other Jewish people. And when the time is right, talk to them about belonging to your synagogue. Ask them if they would ever consider being a part of the synagogue. Be their ambassador, and introduce them to what we know already – if being Jewish is a spark in our soul, synagogues turn that spark into a flame.

RELIGIOUS SCHOOL - RABBI NOGAH MARSHALL, EDUCATIONAL DIRECTOR



One of the proudest moments of my Rabbinate was when I officiated at a B'nai Mitzvah ceremony for a group of adults with special needs while serving as a Rabbi in Palm Beach, Florida in 2004. During my time in Palm Beach I created an Introduction to Judaism class for adults with

special needs through The Jewish Family and
Children Services of Palm Beach County. The goal
of this two year program was to provide these
adults with a Jewish education that would culminate
with a B'nei Mitzvah/Confirmation service.

The majority of these students, ranging in ages 18-65, were never given the opportunity to receive a formal Jewish education. My goal was to provide my students with a Jewish experience that they would cherish for the rest of their lives. At this ceremony, 30 adults formally celebrated their B'nei Mitzvah/Confirmation in their own special way. Some read from the Torah while others opened the ark, read a speech or simply held the Kiddush cup.

Once again, 13 years later, I am in a community that I am so proud to be part of. Congregation Beth El is a special community, as we understand that all children deserve the opportunity to receive a Jewish education no matter what their needs are. Through our ECC special needs program and our Project Lev Religious School program we offer all children the opportunity to receive a proper Jewish education.

As an educator, one never stops learning. I am always looking for ways to improve our program. Although we here at Congregation Beth El have one of the strongest special needs program in the area, there is still more to do. We can do even better. I am thrilled to share with you that Congregation Beth El has been selected to be part of the 2017-2018 United Synagogue of Conservative Judaism Ruderman Inclusion Action Community.

The USCJ Ruderman Inclusion Action Community is a community made up of approximately 20 congregations who will receive consultation and guidance from to develop and implement a vision and action plan for making our kehillah (community) a more inclusive congregation. As part of the

cohort our kehillah will receive tools, training and coaching designed to enable the development of a more inclusive community.

These supports will include:

- Guidance to conduct and analyze introductory assessments
- Coaching in developing an action plan and piloting and/or enhancing/expanding programs
- Site visit and consultation by USCJ's Inclusion Specialist Ed Frim
- Participation in a List Serve and Facebook group, including more than 50 congregations in 2017
- The opportunity to reflect on data at the conclusion of the program with coaches and experts
- A higher profile locally and nationally that will lead to new and more deeply engaged members

As part of the cohort we are thrilled to welcome Beth El member Nicole Landau as the liaison who will, together with myself and the USCJ Inclusion specialist, coordinate and implement our efforts. A taskforce has been formed and will be meeting over the summer to conduct an assessment of the current inclusion practices of our kehillah which will culminate an inclusion action plan for the coming year.
