One Wish

If Gd came to you in a dream and offered to grant you one wish, what would you ask for? According to the Book of Kings in the Hebrew Bible, that's exactly what happened to King

Solomon. Grateful that Solomon had built the Temple (thus bringing so many more people that much closer to Him) Gd offered Solomon one wish. So what did HE ask for? Solomon, the wisest man of all time, asked for a "Lev-Sho-may-ah", literally a "listening heart." Solomon explained that since his kingdom had grown so large so quickly he was meeting new people all the time. Solomon emphasized that the people he met were quite different than him. They spoke with accents, they looked different, and they had different customs than he did. Many had "reputations" that preceded them, what we would call today "stereo-types." What Solomon was truly asking for was a deeper understanding of the diverse people he met. He says explicitly that the ability to truly listen with his heart would help to make him a great ruler.

Gd then grants Solomon his wish, adding, "Because you did not ask for long life; because you did not ask for riches or the defeat of your enemies, I shall give you all of that in addition to the gift of a listening, learning and discerning heart." Solomon awakes from the dream and puts his new found skills into practice. Famously, he is confronted by two prostitutes each of whom claims to have birthed the same son. It would have been so easy for him to jump to conclusions, especially given these women's backgrounds. But it is his ability to listen with his heart that moves Solomon to offer to cut the baby in two; he knows that he'll learn the truth by hearing their response.

We live in an increasingly diverse world. Each day we meet people who are different than us. How we think about the people we don't know says a lot about who we are on the inside. From the time we are little we hear, "Don't talk to strangers." Yet our story, the explicit message of our Holy Torah, is that we were once strangers in a strange land. As a result of our shared experience we are supposed to be understanding, and even protective of the strangers we meet, "for you were strangers in the Land of Egypt." Ours is a sacred tradition that celebrates diversity.

In Hebrew, the word for "responsibility "Ah-ray-voot," comes from the same root as the word "mixture", "Ta-ah-roe-vet." It is our shared sense of responsibility to others that allows our society to come together as one. In fact, we even call "evening", "Erev", from the same root as well, because it's not day and it's not night – it's a mixed time. We are not a black and white People.

What would it mean for you to strive to have more of a "Lev-Sho-may-ah" in the New Year we are about to begin? or Solomon it meant the key to greater wisdom. I would suggest the same holds true for us. How much more can we learn about the world around us when we hone our own skills of listening with our hearts? No two people are the same, and yet we are prone to prejudge nonetheless. Our community, our neighbors, our friends, our families, all of them can benefit from our own personal desire to listen more carefully; with more discernment, more understanding, more patience, and yes, with more love.

And so that is my New Year prayer for all of us; that we continue to develop our own Lev Sho-may-ah; thoughtful, open, soft and tender hearts. For as Solomon learned, when we ask for that, so many other blessings will indeed follow.


Nancy Barr, Staff Accountant



Last year I lit a spark when I introduced the Emergent philosophy to the school. I asked teachers to listen, observe and identify the things children in their

classes are curious about, and are interested in exploring. From this exercise, emerged a long term project that was documented in these giant books. Sheryl's four year old class, for example, explored the building of a chair. Planning, designing and cooperation were the source of success.

We opened the school to 95 children, last year, and we celebrated the end of the school year with 135 children. Our reputation and our commitment to education are obvious.

As I prepare for the new school year, I ask these questions:

- Can we maintain a school that speaks up rather than down to the intellects of children?
- Can our school's curriculum be built from children's questions and wonderings about the world, built on our human and natural desire to create and do?
- Can we develop educational practices that foster -instead of hamper -- creativity and innovation?
- Can we be liberated from the what-has-alwaysbeen, and emerge as a school that emits the inventors, artists, and change makers who will act boldly and courageously in the face of a changing world?
- Can we align learning with the kinds of lives our children are likely to lead? The kind of lives we hope for them?

...And I answer them as well: YES WE CAN!

We have great educators, great facility, great school committee and PTG. We are working together so WE CAN.

This year we will be putting emphasis on creating with Loose Parts (the professional term for "junk"). Loose Parts will be the material we will use to enhance our

theme learning and to express our own imagination. We invite you to spark our fire by contributing to our "junk" bins... Remember, though, we are preschoolers - teachers will not allow very small items.

In the Talmud in tractate Sanhedrin it says:

?אפשר אש בנעורת ואינה מהבהבת Could there be a fire in the chaff that does not flicker or glow?

May this coming year be filled with flickering lights of excitement, discovery, happiness, achievements and growth.

The Early Childhood Center teachers and staff join me in wishing you and your families a happy and healthy New Year.

With Rosh Hashanah still a month away, now is a great time to think about your holiday menu. Time to freshen up the meal? Our selection of contemporary cookbooks will

inspire you. The New Yiddish Kitchen; Gluten-Free and Paleo Kosher Recipes for the Holidays and Every Day by Simone Miller and Jennifer Robins will help you accommodate guests with special dietary needs and preferences. Modern Jewish Cooking, Recipes & Customs for Today's Kitchen by Leah Koening offers plenty of suggestions, generally not complicated. These are just two of the dozens of Jewish cookbooks in our library – come see them and get inspiration for your holiday meals.

New children's books for the High Holiday season are always a welcome sight. This year we have several new titles for youngsters to enjoy. *Maya Prays for Rain* by Susan Tarcov is a rarity – a book about Shemini Atzeret for 5-8 year-olds. A new board book , *Rosh Hashanah is Coming* by Tracy Newman is perfect for toddlers. Beloved children's author Eric Kimmel has a new book, *Little Red Rosie*. In this story based on the familiar *The Little Red* hen, a young girl gets her animal friends to help her bake challah for Rosh Hashanah. In *Sky-High Sukkah* by Rachel Packer, young Leah's dream of having a sukkah in her high-rise apartment building is realized with the help of her caring community.

Several outstanding new novels are set against the background of the Second World War. A Flood of Evil, Book One 1923-1933 by Beth El's own Lewis M. Weinstein is the first of two novels Weinstein is writing about a German Catholic boy and a Polish Jewish girl. Berthold is favored by Nazi party officials, yet is opposed to what the Nazis are doing. Anna wants a more modern life, and wishes to be the first girl from her village to attend the University of Warsaw. How these two meet and fall in love is one aspect of the story. The real interest, for me, is in the details of daily life in the pre-War era and the close-ups Weinstein gives of the highest-ranking Nazis as they ascend to power. The story is framed by a present-day narrative about the daughter of the man who ultimately prosecuted Berthold at Nuremberg: this young woman's quest for more information leads her to interview the aged Berthold in Munich and Anna in Jerusalem. This is an entertaining read that also educates the reader about a key period in history.







